The Michigan Wildflower Association is designed for persons who are interested in Michigan native plants and their habitats. Both days feature informative speakers and nature related vendors. The White Clover (Trifolium Repens) is the traditional variety of clover recognized as a shamrock. A shamrock has three leaves. Those that have four leaves are rare and are the traditional 'lucky charms'. Experts claim that there are about 10,000 three-leaf clovers for every four-leaf clover.

Clover is in the same family as the pea, so it is a legume. White Clover provides nitrogen to turf grass, reduces a lawn's water needs and converts bare soil into biologically active soil that benefits organisms above and below the soil surface. Clover leaves naturally produce anthocyanin, a red pigment which is believed to have certain health benefits.

MAGC By-Laws (Proposed Revisions)

Article I - Beside The Marshall Area Garden Club add (MAGC)

Article III - Section 2 - Delete

Article IV - Section 1 - Dues will be payable no later than the regular May meeting.

Article V - **Section 4** - The **second vice president** along with a committee, shall collect the annual dues update the records, notify delinquent members and send the finalized <u>membership</u> report to the treasurer of the Michigan Garden Clubs, Inc.

Article V - Section 7 - Delete "by a committee appointed by the president."

Article X - Change to "The Robert's Rules of Order."

Article XII - Delete

Article XIII - Becomes Article XII - At the end of the last sentence should read: "and the president's meeting at the State Convention.

Article XIV - Becomes Article XIII

Article XV - Becomes Article XIV
